Black's Flies, Ltd.

Black's Flies, Ltd. was founded in 1996 by Craig Black and his wife, Faith. Craig's love of fly tying began at age six, tying flies with his father, Dennis J. Black, and, later, with Randall Kaufmann. He fished for wild steelhead on Oregon's North Umpqua River with his uncle Bill Black. He worked shipping, receiving, and tied specialty flies at Umpqua Feather Merchants. He moved to Thailand to help set up and oversee the first tying operation in Chiang Mai, Thailand for Umpqua Feather Merchants from 1986 to 1992.

Today, Black's Flies. Ltd. is located in Winfield, British Columbia in the Okanagan country, and specializes in Northwest and Canadian patterns, and specific custom work for US, Canadian, and European customers. Doug's Bugs

Doug Brutocao began Doug's Bugs in 1982 as an outgrowth of his love of fly tying. This was a commercial tying operation with Doug behind the vise. After graduating from Humboldt State University and pursuing other careers, Doug still dreamed of expanding Doug's Bugs and offering other products in addition to his carefully-dressed flies. That opportunity came in 1992 when he purchased The Hackle House, a fly tying materials supplier located in the San Francisco area that dated back to the 1960s.

Today, Doug's comprehensive selection of flies, including those of master tyer Chuck Stranahan, are produced in Thailand at the state-of-the-art Targus Fly and Feather Factory. With assistance from Gary and Jason Borger and Targus Fly and Feather, Doug incorporated the Targus ColorMatch™ System (TCM) of materials into his fly production, and Doug's Bugs offers the complete line of TCM materials, including FoxxFurr™, CealFiber™, SST™, SuperDry™, a series of flash products, and chenille, all accurately color matched.



Doug's packaged material and hook selection is extensive, and he also supplies dealers with a complete line of tying tools, fly lines, leaders, tippet, angling accessories, rod building supplies, books, videos and DVDs. Highland does not have a catalog of standard patterns—all the flies they produce are custom tied to each customer's specifications, which makes for a complicated operation but one that is much in demand. Idylwilde

Zach Mertens paired an international childhood in Asia with two years of professional guiding on the South Fork of the Snake River in Idaho to hatch fledgling Idylwilde in 1997. Zach originally trained five tyers in Manila, Philippines, and today employs 125 full-time tyers. Idylwilde flies are tied to exact customer and signature tyer specifications and are distributed throughout the United States and Canada from Idylwilde's base of operations in Portland, Oregon.

Idylwilde specializes in dry, nymph, emerger, steelhead and Pacific salmon patterns, and they are especially proud of their elite group of signature tyers, who create unique patterns to address specific fishing dilemmas. Signature tyers include Joe Aanes, Elden Berrett, Dave Bloom, Bob Borden, Hogan Brown, Chris Conaty, Ed Engle, Tim Fox, Jeff Hickman, Justin Kamopp, Larry Kingrey, Bill Marts, Ken Morrish, Bob Quigley, Brian Silvey, and Vince Wilcox.
